






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1. Introduction

This scheme recognises the individual contributions and leadership of club and society committee members across key areas of university and student life.

Committee members can progress through bronze, silver, and gold levels of accreditation by completing specific achievements that demonstrate their commitment, initiative, and impact, in a series of different criteria. They will receive rewards for their contributions.

Student groups on Cambridge campus are eligible to take part.

Participating in the scheme is a fantastic way for committees to showcase their achievements, earn recognition for their hard work, and inspire future members and other groups with what's possible.

2. How it works

The Committee Champions scheme recognises the outstanding contributions and leadership of student group committee members for clubs and societies. It's your chance to showcase your achievements, develop valuable skills, and gain official recognition.

Step 1: Get Involved

Any club or society committee member can take part. If you're on a committee, you're eligible.

Step 2: Complete the Essential Criteria

Before moving through the accreditation levels, all participating committee members must first ensure they have all the essential criteria completed. These form the foundation of your involvement and are essential for all clubs and societies.

Step 3: Work Towards Accreditation Tasks

Once the essentials are complete, you can begin completing tasks across key areas of student life:

1. Academic & Employability
2. Leadership & Events
3. Well-being
4. Sustainability
5. Sports Clubs

Step 4: Earn Your Accreditation Level

Progress through the levels by completing more tasks:

- Bronze Accreditation - 6 bronze tasks completed
- Silver Accreditation - 5 silver tasks completed
- Gold Accreditation - 5 gold tasks completed



These achievements will reflect meaningful contributions, leadership, and positive change within your society/club and the wider community.

Step 5: Submission & Verification

When you are ready, submit an online [*form*](#) with evidence of the tasks you've completed. Submissions will be reviewed and verified by your coordinator at the end of each trimester. If approved, your accreditation level will be confirmed to you via email.

Step 6: Get Recognised & Rewarded

Once accredited, you will receive formal recognition and rewards. This is a great way to celebrate your success and boost your CV!



3. Essential Criteria

All the below criteria must be completed before you can progress to bronze, silver or gold accreditation.

- My club/society has an up-to-date page on the website with contact details
- I have completed all my committee training modules
- My club/society consistently update my coordinator through email and the activity's dashboard
- My society has an up-to-date risk assessment, and this has been sent to our coordinator

4. Criteria

a. Academic & Employability

The academic & employability criteria recognise committee members that support club/society members' academic success and career development through activities like revision sessions, guest talks, and career-focused events.

Bronze

- I have helped run at least one revision session for my society across this trimester
- I have helped organise at least 1 academic from our school or course talk at an event for my society

Silver

- I have helped organised at least one external guest speaker event for our members on a topic relevant to our course
- I have helped organised an event or external trip that focuses on exploring your career

Gold

- I have led the planning and delivery of a large-scale academic/career-focused event (e.g. a panel, conference, or collaborative event with another society or organisation).
- My society has organised at least three internal/external guest speakers for our society

b. Leadership & Events

The events criteria recognises committee members that actively engage students by running society-led activities, promoting their group at campus-wide events, and collaborating with others to create inclusive, well-attended experiences.

Bronze



- I have helped my society run a stall at an SU wide event (Welcome, Welcome Back, Global Week etc.)
- I have supported my society to hold one taster session this year for new members

Silver

- My society has held three or more events that have been advertised on the SU website
- My society has held one event or more in collaboration with another society

Gold

- I have helped run two or more stalls in a university building to promote our society
- My society has held an event in which 80% of our society was in attendance



c. Well-being

The well-being criteria involves organising events to promote mental health, collaborating with mental health and well-being organisations, and establishing long-term initiatives to create a lasting impact on student well-being and community.

Bronze

- I have helped my society run at least one well-being focused event* e.g. mindfulness sessions or group fitness activities
- My society have actively promoted mental health & well-being awareness by sharing resources (e.g. through social media)



Silver

- I have helped my society run at least 3 well-being focused events
- My society have collaborated with a mental health organisations, or hosted educational events on well-being (e.g. guest speakers)

Gold

- My society has made a long-term impact on our member well-being by creating lasting initiatives (e.g. a permanent wellness programme)
- My society has collaborated with another society, student group or department within our university to deliver a well-being initiative or event.

*well-being focused event: an event primarily aimed at supporting the well-being of members, promoting relaxation, social connection or health. The reviewing coordinator will make the final decision on whether an event qualifies as well-being focused.



d. Sustainability

The sustainability criteria recognises committee members that prioritise environmentally responsible practices, reduce waste, and actively promote sustainable values through events and collaboration with the university's sustainability team.

Bronze


- I have utilised sustainable promotional materials when promoting our society
- I have ensured my society provided fair-trade refreshments for our society events

Silver

- My society have donated leftover food to local food banks or charities
- My society have donated leftover equipment to local foodbanks or charities

Gold

- I have helped run two or more events focused on sustainability (e.g. litter pick or clothes swap)
- I have worked with the sustainability team at the university to run an event or project



e. Sports Clubs

The sports clubs criteria recognises committee members of sports clubs that promote active participation through regular training, inclusive taster sessions, coaching support, social engagement, and opportunities to compete or showcase their sport.

Bronze

- I have helped my club run at least one taster session or trial this trimester for new members
- My society has found and employed a coach to provide coaching for our members

Silver

- My club have consistently run sporting sessions at least once a week for the duration of the trimester
- My club have run at least one social session outside of our training sessions

Gold

- My club has taken part in at least one external competition or showcase during this academic year
- My club has consistently run sporting sessions at least twice a week for the duration of the trimester

5. Evidence & Submission

When you are ready, you can submit an online [*form*](#) with evidence of the tasks you've completed. Your coordinator will review submissions each trimester. If approved, your accreditation level will be confirmed by email.

Guidance on evidence you can submit

Photographic documentation, event reports, social media posts, attendance records, budget/ planning documents, activities dashboard

Academic & Employability: Speaker invite emails, event attendance sheets, photos with speakers, speaker presentation slides


Events: Activity/events dashboard logs, event planning documents e.g. event budget planner, social media event posts, photographs during events, attendance tracking

Well-being: Session planning documents, participant feedback forms, workshop/session photos, mental health resource sharing screenshots

Sustainability: Photos of sustainable promotional materials, receipts for sustainable marketing items, emails/documentation of food bank donations, donation receipts from charities, email correspondence with university sustainability team

Sports Clubs: Training session attendance logs, calendar of weekly sessions with dates/times/ locations, photos from regular training sessions, social event planning documents e.g. event budget planner, social media posts about social events, competition/showcase registration forms, tournament/match results, photos from competitions

If the panel feel there is a lack of evidence or the student cannot provide much of the above, we can also look at peer and/or leadership testimonials and contextual explanations.



Gold

2. Hosted on SU Committee Member Recognition webpage 25/26
3. Widespread promotion of achievements across SU platforms e.g. Instagram
4. Gold digital badge to add to emails, LinkedIn etc.
